

ZOOM JUNIOR CHURCH

Nearly a year ago, when we went into the first lockdown, Steven Mitchell very kindly offered to run a Junior Church session on Zoom and it was great. I had never heard of Zoom and had no idea how important it would become to enable us all to stay in touch. Steven, Gillian, Gemma and I lead the



sessions which take place every two weeks. It is so lovely to see the children in their own homes - parents and grandparents too! As an adult, I really enjoy joining in when someone else is leading and doing the activities.

The format usually consists of a chat and news. The good thing about the children being at home is that they can show us things. We have been joined by pet rats, a cat and guinea pigs! We do activities such as scavenger hunts (or some sort of activity that they can do physically and includes moving around), spot the difference, Kim's game and hang man.

We usually have a short film clip, a story/message, a craft or colouring activity and a closing prayer. We use the Pilots scheme for our weekly sessions and also cover the major festivals - Harvest, Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

We think about the Christian message and what we can do to help others. The children and adults enjoy the fellowship and take something away with them. (Gillian Ashurst)

A REFLECTION

TRY BIRD WATCHING! 'Look at the birds.' Matthew 6:26 NLT

You may not like the political party that's in power, but you're much better off than the Jewish people Jesus was speaking to here. Their country was occupied by the Romans, and they paid extortionate taxes to keep them in power. They lived as slaves so they worried a lot. Then Jesus came along and said: 'Look at the birds. They don't plant...harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are? Can all your worries add a single moment to your life?' (w. 26-27 NLT). In other words, if you worry a lot-try bird watching! Birds don't know where their next meal is coming from, yet you never see one sitting on a branch having an anxiety attack. So here's the question: 'Aren't you far more valuable to

God than they are?' A man who was out of work, despondent, and worried about feeding his family noticed some birds eating strawberry shortcake from a bin. All at once it dawned on him - 'If God can feed the birds strawberry shortcake, surely He can take care of me too!' Even if you suffer from a poor self-image and think you're not worth taking care of, aren't you still more valuable than a bird? So look at how well your heavenly Father takes care of them, and remind yourself that He will take care of you too. If anxiety is robbing you of happiness during the day and sleep at night, make up your mind to live by this Scripture: 'Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you'd Peter 5:7 NLT

URC COMMITMENT FOR LIFE EXTRACT - NICARAGUA



Land of Coffee and Honey, Nicaragua is the second poorest country in Latin America and deeply affected by climate change. 80% of the population depends on agriculture. Our partner Soppexcca is an umbrella organisation representing 650 farmers and 18 coffee cooperatives.

Changes in weather patterns area affecting crop yields. Also, recent drops in the price of coffee, have forced farmers to diversify.

Arlen Joel Lopez Pineda, a young honey farmer (25) near Jinotega who works with Christian Aid's wonderful partner Soppexcca, writes:

'We started with four young farmers in 2014 with support from Soppexcca for a project specifically for young people who are family members of farmers. I had seen beekeeping before so when Soppexcca contacted us with the idea of the beekeeping project, I said yes.

The next year, we had good honey production. The next year, more farmers joined us, and we helped train them. From 20 hives in the community, it went to 50. We also make honey products that helps coughs, shampoo and honey chocolate, creamy honey mixed with chocolate and honey and peanuts.

The beekeeping is part of a strategy to diversify the farm. Climate change is affecting the coffee, with half the bean being ripe and other half not. With the beekeeping we can see the effects of climate change. In the summer, it's raining and then it's too hot and sunny, when it's dry you have the flowers and when the flowers are ready to be harvested by the bees, it rains, and the bees don't come out of the hives. In the future we want to grow and have our own trademark and a certificate of hygiene from the government. We can then start selling in supermarkets. Producing honey is something pretty. We aren't polluting, and we are helping to pollinate the flowers and it's another means of diversification for our farm. We want to thank Soppexcca for supporting us with hives and technological support.'

Indonesia - South East Asia- Outreach to the Bonai People
Please pray for the Bonai people of Indonesia. One of the WO
teams has made an exploratory prayer trip to visit this group. Pray
for workers who feel a distinct call from the Lord to reach them.
Pray that the Lord would open the hearts of the Bonai to receive
the gospel. Pray for creative ideas for our team planning to reach
them. Pray that, in years to come, there would be a thriving church
planting movement among the Bonai (World Outreach Int.)

China - North & East Asia - Evangelism to the Uyghur People
The Uyghur church largely survives in secret. Small groups of
believers pepper the vast land, three times the size of France.
Squeezed on both sides by Muslims who consider defection not
only a religious but a cultural betrayal, and Communism that insists
there is no God. Praise God for stories emerging from the camps
of believers having led others to faith, and others who have come
out stronger, inspired to build the church. A Bible translation
project nears completion, and an app has had hundreds of
thousands of scripture viewings and many enquiries
(People International)

West Asia - Translators in this region.

This is an opportunity to pray for the 2.2 million Zam* speakers in a part of West Asia that is hostile to the gospel. Many Zam speakers also speak their West Asian national language, but not all do. Pray that the gospel will especially capture the hearts of those people who only speak Zam. Pray that the translation team will know God's guidance as they translate portions of the Old Testament to record and dub a film version of the lives of the prophets. *Name changed for security. Scotland - Western Europe - Help for addicts in Scotland.
Scotland has the worst drug-related death rates in Europe. Pray for Betel which focus on those with addictions. Betel in Scotland would like to open a women's centre, and also another men's centre as their Motherwell property has limited capacity. Pray for the men currently there, for each one to come to freedom in Christ (WEC International)

The children were taught how to plant.


Many things could be grown from seeds,

And keep it all clear from the weeds.


With hard graft, sacrifice and good cheer,
