With Christmas now a fading memory, we move into February and the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. We are no longer in the darkest part of the year and slowly we will begin to enjoy lighter mornings and evenings.

Lent used to be a time when the cupboards were stripped of goods to make pancakes; a last sweet treat before we avoided fatty and sweet foods until Easter. Although many of us are not as strict as that anymore, Lent is still an important season for us as Christians.

Lent is a time where we prepare ourselves physically, mentally and spiritually for Easter. To hear again the news of the risen Lord and restoration of All Things. The service in Celebration of Ken's life was held on morning of 18th January at Preston crematorium.

Ken's long career with Post Office communications took him to many places, including Africa where he carried out training for some years. There were several amusing stories, include from Ken's brother about a working holiday they shared in the former Yugoslavia. By mistake, they ventured over the border into Albania and were arrested by the military. However, Ken managed to charm them and spent the night showing them card tricks!

The service in Celebration of Nigel's life was held in church on the afternoon of 18th January.

Nigel's contribution to the life of the United Reformed Church is immeasurable. In addition to his life as a teacher for over 30 years, Nigel became a local preacher in the Methodist Church in 1958; Commissioned as a Pastor in 1975, and Ordained as a Minister in 1978. 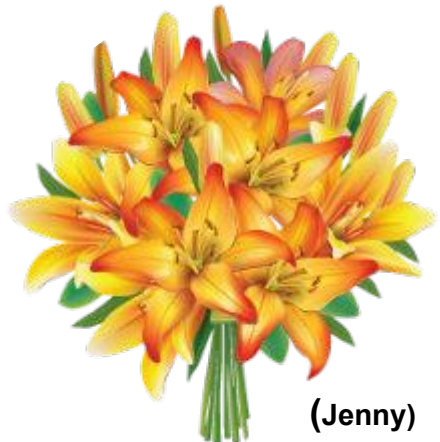

CHARITABLE DONATIONS

UNICEF MITES SCHEME



Your **Mites (5p/10p)** donations have realised **£ 30.85** for the period 1 Oct to 31 Dec 2023 which will purchase a further **385 Oral Rehydration Sachets** which cost circa 8p each. Just 5 sachets have the potential to save the life of a child suffering from dehydration, a common killer in children who are malnourished or suffering from diseases like cholera or dysentery. Such essential support continues to be vital.

The value of your Mites is sent quarterly to the Mites Scheme at the end of Mar, Jun, Sep and Dec each year and acknowledgement is sent to the Elders by coordinator Keith Garner.

Containers (Green x2) for receipt of your Mites (5p/10p) are located on the front end of the “stage” at the rear of the Worship area.

WATER AID

Also on the stage is a **Glass Jar** for your **“pennies / copper coins”** in support of **Water Aid**.

It is unacceptable that millions of people are in desperate need of clean water, adequate food, fuel for electricity, and urgently needed medical supplies... We weep with broken hearts as we hear of hospitals, mosques, churches, and schools damaged and destroyed by this war. In Gaza, there is no safe place. There is no refuge. There is no escape.

Commitment for Life supporters agree that the current violence cannot be decontextualised. Gazans have little hope in the face of seven decades of relentless disenfranchisement. Three-quarters of Gazans are refugees dating back to 1948. Gaza has become an open-air prison, according to *Human Rights Watch*. Illegal settlements expand every day in the West Bank. Illegal Israeli settlers act with impunity, attack Palestinians, and force the indigenous people from their ancestral lands. Nevertheless, none of this should be used to justify the violence used by either Hamas or Israel in pursuit of political objectives.

Commitment for Life has been supporting Christian Aid partners in Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory for well over 30 years. It is precisely these kinds of long-term, sustained partnerships that provide concrete examples of how to break out of vicious cycles of violence and retribution. Please continue to pray. Let's not give up hope but continue in faithfulness to trust in God for justice for all.

WORLD PRAYER NEWS

There are many local issues, as well as widely publicised issues in the media, which we are called to pray for. Sometimes it is good to focus also on lesser known issues in our world and on Christian endeavours that we can bring before God too. This page focuses on just a few of the world prayer items on the website of [Global Connections](https://globalconnections.org.uk/)

UK – [Al Massira](#) : Pray for the United Kingdom, and for Al Massira, as many AM groups continue to grow. Friends on a journey to meet the Messiah are gathering in various places across the UK, including people from the Middle East. Some are new to the Family of God and others are pursuing the truth. May they find Him, love Him, and follow Him! Praise God for the AM resources available - currently in 38+ languages. Praise God for the wide-spread use of the AM App being used across the world - and is of great help!

Macedonia-[World Share](#) : Pray for the Evangelical Church in Soukcraft, as they transition to a better location, following the opening of their new premises, with increased capacity for mission workers, and a larger space for church use. Pray also for the Evangelical Church in North Macedonia as their churches work with Muslims, a challenging mission field. Pray for protection and strength in the face of spiritual opposition

Guinea Bissau-[Reach Beyond](#) Radio is popular in Guinea Bissau but their infrastructure is very poor. One month after a radio partner in Guinea Bissau started to pray about increasing the broadcast coverage of their Christian station, a 'Kingdom investor' came out of the blue and asked if they had considered broadcasting into more of the country! Pray as we help the partner to investigate a reliable and cost-effective way to send their signal over large distances to the repeater towers that will be required. Pray for the many unreached people who will hear about Jesus

China-[Chinese Church Support Ministries](#) There is an increasing pressure for churches and Christians to demonstrate total allegiance to the Chinese Communist Party and President Xi Jinping, above any commitment to Jesus Christ and the Bible. Pray for church leaders and individual believers that they will hold firm to the truth of God's Word and in obeying the Lord Jesus Christ. Pray also that they will experience God's protection as they do so.

A REFLECTION

AN AMAZING PROMISE

I will...show you...things, which you do not know.'
Jeremiah 33:3 NKJV

Read this: "Call to me and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know" (v. 3 NKJV).

Who said that? The God of the universe! What do you think your chances are of getting through on the phone to a president or prime minister? Zero! Yet regardless of your education, sophistication, ethnic background, or financial status, you can talk to God and He will talk back to you. And He doesn't just promise to answer your prayers but to 'show you great and mighty things, which you do not know'.

Sometimes we say, 'It's the not knowing that scares me.' Companies close and workers get laid off. Routine medical checkups reveal life-threatening challenges. Terrorists threaten our safety, and politicians betray our trust. A little boy prayed, 'Lord, bless Mummy, Daddy, baby, and me. And, Lord, take care of Yourself, because if anything happens to You, we're all sunk!' You say, 'But I'm not sure God has ever spoken to me.'

If you're a Christian, He has spoken to you at least once. And if He will speak to you once, He will speak to you twice. But you have to talk to Him and let Him talk to you through His Word and His indwelling Spirit. Sometimes God waits before He answers you because He is working on both ends of the line. He is working on the thing you prayed about, and He is working to get you ready for it. And sometimes the second thing takes longer than the first
