Joyce and Rita have more information so please just ask either of us, we are very grateful for your help and appreciate everything donated.





### **ELDERS' NOTES**


### Security.

For some time now, we, along with many other churches and organisations, have been discussing church security in the wake of the terrible stabbings carried out in Southport last year. We have noted comments from church members who feel that during worship on Sunday mornings, the front door of the building should be locked after the start of the service, and the opposite view from people who do not. We are sure that none of us want to think that the church should be a place which is "Locked". But, given the background of this debate, we have decided that for the safety of all, we will ask the door stewards to lock the door perhaps five minutes after commencement of worship. The front door is easily opened by turning the internal handle from the inside. A bell push will be fitted to the side of the door, and the duty Elder will hold a box during the service which will flash if the bell is operated. We trust that everyone will understand the reasons for this course of action. The Elders

#### **Winter Fuel Costs**

We have recently been reviewing the hiring costs of our premises, and part of the exercise has required us to look closely at the use of power, electricity and gas etc. The costs of the heating and power currently stands at an average of £1,500 per month. With this in mind, a number of members have discussed the possibility of using the church Hall for certain services during the winter months, thereby saving the cost of heating the Worship Space for one hour. The heating needs to be switched on 24 hours before, in order to heat the space involved, whilst this is not required when simply heating the Hall

We felt that this should be shared with you, and will advise you further in due course. The Elders





### A REFLECTION

### **KEEP IT SIMPLE**

'Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand.' Mark 4:33 NIV

If you're serious about reaching and teaching people, there are two things you must try to do:

1) Talk to them, not above them. A primary schoolboy was eating an apple in the back of the car. 'Daddy,' he said, 'why is my apple turning brown?' His father explained: 'Because after you assimilated the skin on the exterior, the core structure of the apple came into contact with the atmosphere, which caused it to oxidise, thus changing its molecular structure and transforming it into a different colour.' After a long silence, the little boy replied, 'Daddy, are you talking to me?'

Can the listener understand and apply what you're saying? Paul told the church at Corinth, 'I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready. Indeed, you are still not ready' (1 Corinthians 3:2 NIV).

Jesus made a point of tailoring His remarks so the people listening could grasp the message. The Bible says, 'With...parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand.' Think about it: Jesus was God, and He could easily have awed us with His knowledge. But because His desire was to change our lives for the better, He stayed on our level and spoke in a language we understand. And you must learn to do the same.

2) Say it over and over again. The fundamental law of learning is repetition. It's been said that people have to hear something sixteen times before they believe it and really 'get it'. The question that should concern you isn't, 'What will I say?' but, 'What will people take away from it?'

### Secured: Secured - Al Massirah


