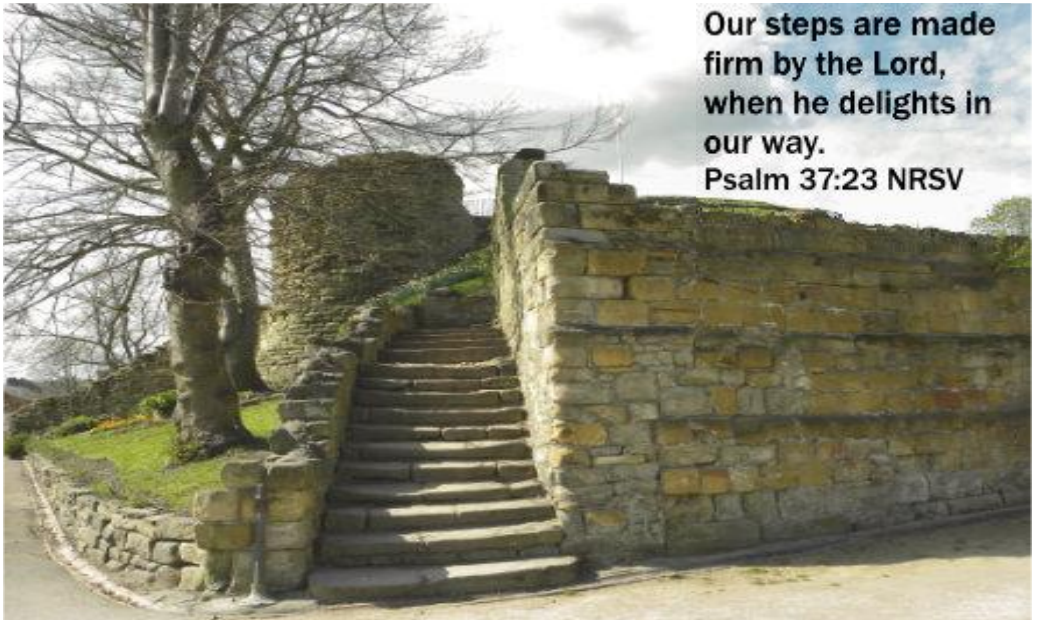

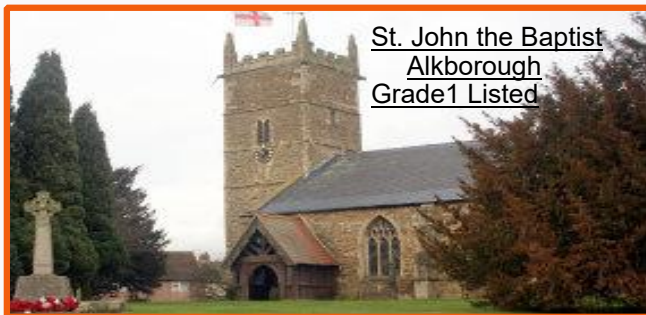
ELDER'S MATTERS

EACH DAY OF YOUR LIFE IS A GIFT

'Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.'

Psalms 90:12 NKJV

Motivational speaker Denis Waitley describes an experience that marked his life forever. He was trying to catch a flight for a speaking commitment and was running through the airport terminal. He reached the gate just as the agent closed the door. Denis explained his dilemma, but the agent didn't re-open the door. That's when his annoyance turned into anger. He stomped out of the boarding area and returned to the ticket counter to lodge a complaint and reschedule his flight. His anger increased as he waited for over twenty minutes in a line that hardly moved. Right before his turn at the ticket counter, an announcement over the intercom changed his life, because he realised that by missing that flight, his life had been saved. The flight he missed, Flight 191 from Chicago to Los Angeles, had crashed on take-off with no survivors. Denis never lodged his complaint. He also never returned his invalidated ticket for Flight 191. He brought it home and tacked it on a notice board in his office. In the aftermath of that experience, anytime he felt irritated or upset, all he had to do was look at that ticket from Flight 191. It was an unforgettable reminder that life is a gift that should not be undervalued. The psalmist wrote:

'The days of our lives *are* seventy years; and if by reason of strength they are eighty years...it is soon cut off, and we fly away. So, teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom'.
(Psalm 90 vv. 10, 12 NKJV).

Europe - United Kingdom: [Navigators](#)

God is currently doing an amazing work across the Western church over the past few years, as there has been a significant increase in the number of people coming to Christ, especially among the younger generations. As Navigators UK we feel called to help this wave of new Jesus followers to continue to journey with him long into the future and to help others around them to do the same. With that in mind, we are currently developing an online video resource focused on jump starting the relational heart behind making disciples - it is called The Alongsider Course!

Caribbean- Haiti - [World Share](#)

With over half the population in Haiti facing severe food insecurity and violence, pray for provision so families can access food and for protection for teachers and students as schools remain open amid instability. Ask God to strengthen the PiFò Haiti team as they support vulnerable groups and sustain essential programmes despite poor roads and security risks. Give thanks for the community garden producing crops like corn, okra, pineapples, peppers, onions, cassava and papayas, and pray that these efforts will bring nourishment and hope to many families. Pray for wisdom for leaders and for hope to take root in every community they serve.

Europe - United Kingdom: [2:19 Teach to Reach](#)

Pray for 2:19 Teach to Reach who support UK churches encouraging them to embrace the nations locally through English language teaching and outreach. Give thanks that we are still able to share freely about God in UK; that seeds planted in learners' hearts at Christmas outreach events will be watered; that language barriers would be broken to share the gospel further; give thanks for new church contacts from recent events and pray for energy, capacity and financial provision for staff in meeting the needs of as many churches and learners as possible.

Europe - Macedonia: [Transform Europe Network](#)

Pray for the preparations of the Night to Shine Event for which Dragan and Biljana Manevi are the lead organisers on the 13th February 2026. It has a great impact on the local community of Resen. 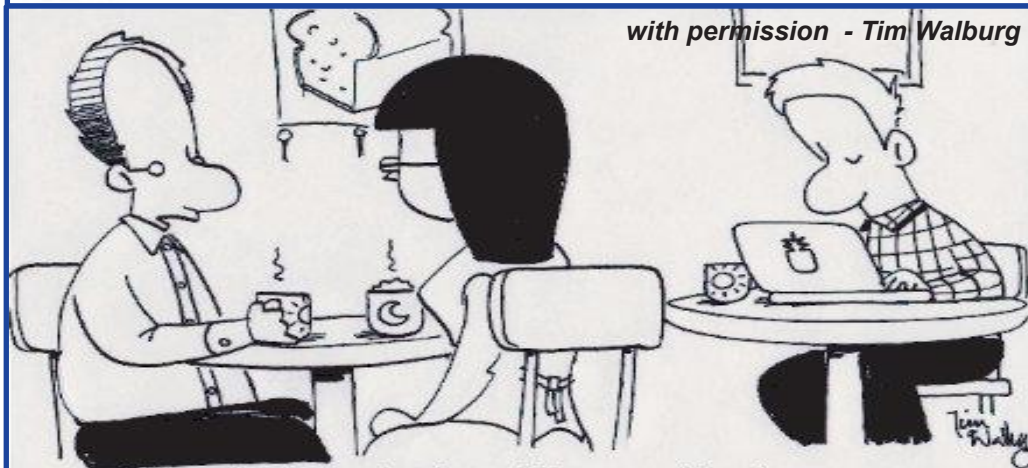
